Answer sheet Pupil Transportation Safety Quiz



Student responsibilities

- 1. The driver is responsible for the safety and well being of all passengers. He/she has complete authority to maintain order and discipline, and must see that the rules are followed.
- 2. The driver must give students a signal to cross the road once traffic, from all directions, has come to a complete stop. The crossing arm helps to keep students at a safe and visible distance from the front of the bus.
- 3. The noise level on the bus could distract the bus driver and bring about an unsafe and unpleasant journey for the passengers.
- 4. Disciplinary action, possibly including the loss of transportation, may result in case of violation.

Getting on the bus

- 1. Arrive five (5) minutes before the bus.
- 2. Stay on the sidewalk or shoulder of the road. Respect property, pedestrians and other students.
- 3. Assure that you're out of the bus path. If more that one student is waiting at the bus stop, line up in a single file, and wait until the bus comes to a complete stop before moving forward. If you must cross the road, wait for the driver's signal.
- 4. Be courteous, get on the bus quickly and carefully, and hold on to the handrail while making sure no strings or loose items get caught.
- 5. Go directly to your seat.

Riding on the bus

- 1. Obey the driver Respect others Remain seated Keep the aisle clear Talk quietly
- 2. Obtain approval of the driver to open windows or emergency door. Nothing must hang out or be thrown out of the windows of the bus.
- 3. Eating and drinking are not allowed on the bus.
- 4. While riding on the bus, place your belongings on your lap or under the seat. Keep aisle clear.
- 5. In case of an emergency, do not hesitate to get the driver's attention. Please avoid unnecessary conversation while the driver does his job.

Getting off the bus

- 1. Be courteous, always walk, hold on to the handrail, and follow the driver's instructions.
- 2. Never cross the road behind the school bus. The driver must be able to see you at all times.
- 3. Stand at a safe distance (at least 3 metres) away from the bus.
- 4. All school buses are equipped with a crossing arm, which keeps students approximately 2 metres away from the front of the bus.
- 5. If crossing in front of the school bus, get the driver's signal, look both ways, then cross.
- 6. The bus driver gives students the signal to cross the road.

In case of an emergency

1. Follow instructions from the <u>bus driver</u>, a designated person assigned by the driver or other emergency personnel.
