

# DOCUMENT "A"

## MINISTER'S DETERMINATION CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL

Pursuant to Regulation 87-83 under the Clean Environment Act

June 1<sup>st</sup> 2009

File Number: 4561-3-1206

1. In accordance with section 6(6) of the Regulation, it has been determined that the undertaking may proceed following approval under all other applicable acts and regulations.
2. Commencement of this undertaking must occur within three years of the date of this Determination. Should commencement not be possible within this time period the undertaking must be registered under the *Environmental Impact Assessment Regulation (87-83)* – Clean Environment Act again, unless otherwise stated by the Minister of Environment.
3. The proponent shall adhere to all obligations, commitments, monitoring and mitigation measures presented in the EIA registration document dated March 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2009, and subsequent addendums, as well as all those identified in subsequent correspondence during the registration review. Additionally, the proponent shall submit a summary table detailing the status of each Condition listed in this Determination to the Manager of the Project Assessment Section of the Department of Environment (DENV) every 6 months from the date of this Determination until such a time as all the Conditions have been met.
4. In the event that any neighbouring well is impacted by the implementation of the project, the proponent shall remediate or if necessary replace that well.
5. The proponent must obtain the appropriate *Approvals to Construct, Operate* and for *Land Application* prior to the onset of operation. Please contact the Manager of the Energy and Manufacturing Section, DENV at (506) 444-4599.
6. Although no archaeological sites are presently recorded at this location, there still exists the possibility of encountering unrecorded archaeological resources (of historic and prehistoric significance) during excavation activities. If the proponent suspects that he has come upon remains of archaeological significance, all excavation must cease and the Archaeological Services Unit, Heritage Branch (WC&S) should be contacted immediately at 453-2756.
7. The proponent shall ensure that all developers, contractors and operators associated with the construction and operation of the project comply with the above requirements.
