

More than 200 centenarians in New Brunswick

- Growth in the centenarian population has been steadily rising due to gains in life expectancy.
- In New Brunswick, the 2016 Census enumerated 210 people aged 100 years and older, compared to 180 in 2011 and 140 in 2006.
- More women than men reach the age of 100. In this age group, there were seven times as many women in New Brunswick as men. The 2016 Census counted 180 women and 25 men aged 100 and over.
- Overall in Canada, 8,230 centenarians were counted in 2016. People aged 100 and older were the fastest growing age group between 2011 and 2016, with growth of 41.3% during this period.
