## Majority of private dwellings are single-detached houses

Dwellings are divided broadly into two types: <u>private</u> and <u>collective</u>. This report focuses on private dwellings, which are classified according to their <u>structural type</u>, such as single-detached, apartment or mobile home.

- The 2016 Census enumerated 747,101 people in New Brunswick. Among the population living in the province (a small number of New Brunswickers reside outside Canada on government, military or diplomatic postings), 97.8% resided in a private dwelling and 2.2% lived in a collective dwelling.
- The most common type of dwelling in New Brunswick in 2016 was the single-detached house, accounting for 69.3% or 221,515 of the 319,775 occupied private dwellings in the province. This was the third highest proportion of single-detached houses in Canada, and was above the national share of 53.6%.
- For the remaining dwellings in the province in 2016, 13.8% were in apartment buildings with fewer than five storeys, 1.2% were in apartment buildings that have five or more storeys, 4.2% were apartments in a duplex and 11.4% were other types of dwellings.
- The share of single-detached houses in the province has fallen over time (from 72.9% in 2001), while the proportion of apartment dwellings (those in low- and high-rise buildings, as well as duplexes) has increased—to 19.3% in 2016 from 17.8% in 2001.
- Among the urban centres in New Brunswick, Miramichi CA had the largest share of single-detached houses in 2016 (76.9%), while Moncton CMA had the smallest (55.5%). The Saint John CMA had the highest proportion of apartment dwellings, with nearly 3 in 10 dwellings (29.5%) located in low- or highrise buildings, or in duplexes.
