## Proportion of households comprised of couples with children continues to decline

- Trends in the share of couples living with or without children reflect the growing diversity of households and families. The gap has widened between these types of households in New Brunswick.
- In 2001, the percentage of New Brunswick households comprised of couples with children (32.8\%) exceeded those comprised of couples without children (26.5\%). By 2011 there was a shift, with a higher proportion of households comprised of couples without children (30.3\%) than households with children ( $25.7 \%$ ). The gap between the two widened further in 2016, with $30.9 \%$ of households comprised of couples without children and $23.7 \%$ comprised of couples with children.
- In Canada, the proportion of couple households with children has been decreasing over time, but it continues to make up a larger share than households comprised of couples without children. In 2016, $26.5 \%$ of households were comprised of couples with children and $25.8 \%$ were comprised of couples without children.
