

Employment income is principal source of total income

The total income for the population in private households can be broken down into two main components, market income and government transfers. Refer to <u>income concepts</u> for more information.

- The main component of market income is employment income. In 2015, 68.3% of New Brunswickers 15 years of age and over had some employment income. Nationally, 71.3% earned income from employment.
- The median employment income in the province in 2015 was \$29,124, up from \$25,497 in 2005. The median employment income among men in 2015 was \$10,000 higher than that of women—at \$34,784 and \$24,769 respectively. In Canada, the corresponding levels were higher—at \$39,836 for men and \$28,474 for women—and the income gap between the two was slightly wider (\$11,400).
- Government transfers made up a small percentage of total income in 2015 (16.9%) compared to market income (83.1%). Nevertheless, seven of 10 New Brunswickers (70.9%) received some form of government transfers with a median amount of \$8,164. Nationally, 68.9% of Canadians received income from government transfers with a median amount of \$5,453.
