2016 Census – Release 5 Immigration and ethnocultural diversity October 25, 2017



Almost two-thirds of recent immigrants admitted under the economic category

The <u>admission category</u> was added to the 2016 Census and provides information on the conditions under which immigrants have been granted the right to permanently live in Canada. Data are available for immigrants admitted since 1980. There are four major categories: economic immigrant, immigrant sponsored by family, refugee and other immigrant. A **recent immigrant** refers to a person who obtained a landed immigrant or permanent resident status up to five years prior to the census. For the 2016 Census, this period is January 1, 2011, to May 10, 2016.

- New Brunswick had 9,330 new immigrants who permanently settled in the province from 2011 to 2016. The majority (65.1%) of these recent immigrants were admitted under the economic category when principal applicants, spouses and dependants were taken into account. Of these recent economic immigrants, 85.3% were admitted through the Provincial Nominee Program.
- In addition, 1 in 5 (21.2%) recent immigrants were admitted as refugees and 1 in 10 (13.3%) recent immigrants were admitted under the family class to join family already in the country. Only 0.4% of recent immigrants were granted permanent resident status under other programs.

•	The situation is different for immigrants who were admitted to Canada during the 1980s and were living
	in New Brunswick in 2016. Smaller proportions were economic immigrants (44.5%) and refugees (10.4%),
	while a larger proportion were immigrants sponsored by family (44.3%).
