

Growth of the visible minority population

The *Employment Equity Act* defines visible minorities as "persons, other than Aboriginal peoples, who are non-Caucasian in race or non-white in colour".

- The visible minority population in the province continues to grow. In 2016, 24,535 individuals were identified as belonging to the visible minority population; they represented 3.4% of New Brunswick's total population. Twenty years ago, the 1996 Census reported that roughly 8,000 people (or 1.1% of the total population) were members of the visible minority population.
- By comparison, visible minorities comprised 22.3% of Canada's total population in 2016, double their proportion in 1996 (11.2%).
- With an estimated 7,000 people, Blacks formed the largest visible minority group in New Brunswick and accounted for 28.5% of the visible minority population.
- Visible minorities in the province were younger than the total population; they had a median age of 28.8 years in 2016. Children aged 14 and under made up 26.5% of the visible minority population, while seniors 65 years of age and older made up roughly 5%.
- Visible minorities were more likely to experience low income than the total population. In 2015, almost 40% of visible minorities lived in low income compared to 17.1% for the total population.
