2016 Census – Release 6 Labour November 29, 2017



Registered nurse remains the most common occupation for women

Occupation refers to the kind of work performed in a job, a job being all the tasks carried out by a particular worker to complete his or her duties. An occupation is a set of jobs that are sufficiently similar in work performed. The occupational data of the 2016 Census are produced using the National Occupational Classification (NOC) 2016.

- New Brunswick women, aged 15 years and over, comprised just under half of the employed labour force (49.8%) in 2016.
- The 2016 Census provides the distribution of workers across 500 detailed occupations. The most common occupation for women was registered nurse and registered psychiatric nurse (accounting for 4.3% of all employed women), followed by cashier (4.1%) and retail salesperson (3.8%). Registered nurse was also the top occupation in 2011.
- Considering the 10 most common occupations for women, women accounted for more than 90% of workers in administrative assistants (96.7%) and registered nurses and registered psychiatric nurses (94.5%).
