WEEKLY NEW BRUNSWICK INFLUENZA REPORT

Reporting period: September 13 – September 19, 2009 (week 37)

Week 35 marked the start of the 2009-2010 Influenza Season

1. Reports of influenza-like illness (ILI) from Flu Watch sentinel physicians in New Brunswick:
(9 physicians recruited so far this year (2008/2009) report the number of patients with ILI symptoms over total number of patients seen on one day each week):

8 physicians reported a total of 9 cases of ILI of the 275 patients seen for any reason during this reporting period

This week, the ILI consultation rate was 32.7 consultations per 1,000 patient visits which is an increase from last week. The sentinel response rate was 89%.

New Brunswick Influenza Virus Surveillance Program
 (specimens are submitted by recruited sentinel physicians, Emergency Rooms, nursing homes and some community physicians). All laboratory specimens are tested using a real-time PCR assay, which is a rapid detection method designed for detection of all known variants of influenza A and B. All laboratory-confirmed cases are reported for the week when laboratory confirmation was received.

Graph 1: Number and percent of positive influenza specimens in New Brunswick (based on data from Dumont Laboratory), by week, as of September 19, 2009


