

How to Find Alternative Format Documents in the Catalogue: Tip Sheet

Option 1

When you want to find out if a specific title is available in a particular format, type the title in the *Search* field and then use the menu on the left side to narrow your results by the **format** you want.

Option 2

When you want to find all titles available in a particular format, click on the **Accessible Formats** feature to limit your search results to items in the desired **format**.

- **MP3 Audiobooks on CD** contain compressed audio files, so usually a book will just be one, or sometimes two MP3 CDs. They are a good choice if swapping discs frequently while listening to an audiobook is difficult.
- **Playaways** are small (pocket-sized) devices similar to MP3 players, preloaded with one audiobook. They run on one AAA battery and require headphones or speakers for sound, but require no equipment for playback. They are a good choice for listening on the go, or when no audio equipment is available.
- **eAudiobooks** are MP3 audiobooks that can be borrowed from the



*Format searches for all of the alternative media formats will give you results for items in those formats. For example, if you did not want books IN braille but ABOUT braille you would simply need to perform a Keyword search for "braille".


How do I find audiobooks and eBooks in Electronic Library NB?

Downloadable audiobooks and eBooks are available through **OverDrive**. You can either browse by particular subject or file type or you can do an advanced search. Before downloading anything from OverDrive, patrons may need to download some additional software programs (ex. the OverDrive app, Adobe Digital Editions).








