Wiring permits are required to be obtained <u>prior to commencement of work for all electrical installations</u>.

For residential installations, a permit is required for work exceeding 10 outlets or above 5kW. Only under exceptional circumstances, the Electrical Inspector may grant permission for work to commence prior to obtaining a wiring permit.

Electrical installations commenced prior to obtaining a wiring permit or permission from the Electrical Inspector will be subject to a special inspection fee of \$100 per hour plus HST and utility connection being withheld without notice.

Notification

Notification of construction points is required for all new dwellings and single swelling. Contractors are required to notify Technical Inspection Services, via 1-888-659-3222 when the construction points <u>are complete and ready for inspection</u> as follows:

- Underground (When trench is open and conduits, cables, conductors are visible)
- Rough-in (all floors completed)
- Service entrance (complete with panel tied in, labelled and covers installed)
- Final (house is complete, all devices, light fixtures and covers installed)

OK to Energize for Service Entrance will only be sent to the utility if a rough-in inspection has been called in.

An inspector may choose to inspect the construction points within two (2) working days (48 working hours) of notification.

Failure to give proper notification may result in suspension of licence privileges and utility connection being withheld.

In instances where covering has been applied to walls and ceilings prior to two (2) working days (48 working hours) of notification, the utility connection may be withheld until covering is removed.
