PURPOSE

To establish procedural standards for administration of clients held under the authority of immigration orders.

LEGISLATIVE AUTHORITY

Policy directive only. Corrections Act NB Regulation 35(a)

SCOPE

This policy applies to all employees of the Adult Custody Services division of the Department of Justice Public Safety.

POLICY GUIDELINES

Clients held under an immigration order will be considered escape risks. Appropriate security measures will be implemented.

PROCEDURE

Regional Director


The Superintendent or designate will ensure that the Director of Adult Custody Services is informed of all details and final dispositions involving clients held on an immigration order.

Immigration Advised

Upon receipt of an immigration order for a client already in custody, the immigration officer will be advised of the release date and asked to come to the institution to take charge of the client on that date.

Release

The client will not be released upon the release date, except to the custody of an immigration officer.
