To provide procedural guidelines for the inventory, inspection, and storage of protective equipment used by staff.

LEGISLATIVE AUTHORITY

NB Corrections Act.

SCOPE


This policy applies to all employees of the Adult Custody Services division of the Department of Justice and Public Safety.

POLICY GUIDELINES

Institutions will have emergency protective equipment ready for use by staff trained for its use.

Emergency protective equipment:

- Protective riot shield
- Protective helmets and visors
- Gloves
- Kevlar neck and forearm guards
- Athletic supporter and cup
- Shin/ankle guards
- Protective coverall (fire retardant)
- Stab Vest
- Oleoresin Capsicum (pepper spray)
- Electro-Muscular Disruption Devices
- Megaphone
- Video camera
- Medical Spill Kits



PROCEDURE

Inspections

Monthly inspections or inventory will be conducted by a person designated by the Superintendent

Equipment approval

All equipment available requires the approval of the Director of Adult Custody Services

Restraining equipment

Restraints used in the day-to-day operations shall not be considered part of the emergency equipment inventory

Storage

Equipment will be stored in a secure area, away from client living and work areas.
