## **SCOPE**

This policy applies to all employees of the Adult Custody Services division of the Department of Justice and Public Safety.

## **POLICY GUIDELINES**

Any law enforcement request to place a member of their personnel in a cell with a client(s), as an informant, will be referred to the Director of Adult Custody Services

# **PROCEDURE**

The Director of Adult Custody Services will contact the commanding officer, Criminal Investigations Branch

The Commanding Officer of the Criminal Investigation Branch shall confirm to the Director of Adult Custody Services the necessity of approval in the case under consideration.

No law enforcement personnel will act as an informant without the approval of the Director of Adult Custody Services.
